

Addressing unmet clinical needs, practices and patient outcomes: the impact of EU-funded projects.

19 December 2022

A large number of public-funded projects at the EU, national or regional level aim to address unmet clinical needs and improve clinical practices as well as patient outcomes by developing diagnostic/prognostic tools or advanced therapies. Investigators of three of these EU projects (COVIRNA, ENVISION, COVend) organise a joint webinar to discuss their achievements and challenges in common – which are not specific to them but are often shared by projects in the research and medical technology development process.

They will discuss successful practices on how to respond to clinicians' expectations at the same time as patients' needs. A panel discussion will also tackle the question of securing sustainable funding for research and innovation initiatives and risk mitigation of these investments. Link

Meta faces record EU privacy fines

POLITICO- By Vincent Manancourt. The Big Tech firm looks set to soon face a huge regulatory bill for all three of its social networks, Facebook, WhatsApp and Instagram.

The detail and possible value of the monetary penalty will remain under wraps until then, but the triplet of fines could add up to over €2 billion, financial statements by Meta indicate — setting a new record for the highest fines under the European Union's feared General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) received by a single company in one go. Link

Women leaders are the key to sustainable climate solutions

EURACTIV- By Ebru Özdemir. Women's leadership has been shown to result in greater responsiveness to citizens' needs, as well as increased cooperation in delivering sustainable peace and improved outcomes of climate-related projects and policies.

Whilst representative leadership is more effective, and women's leadership on climate change has been proven to have a more significant impact, women do not currently play an equal part in the decision-making processes and labour markets, which ultimately prevents their participation in climate planning, policymaking, and implementation. Yet, women's leadership has resulted in greater responsiveness to citizens' needs, increased cooperation in delivering sustainable peace, and improved outcomes of climate-related projects and policies. The Ecosystem: regional innovation goes international as new EU scheme gets off the ground

ScienceBusiness- By Ian Mundell. An accelerator for digital health companies involving ten regions across Europe is the first project to be funded through the Interregional Innovation Investment programme. Now stakeholders are looking for some fine-tuning in how the scheme operates

After a hesitant start, the EU's Interregional Innovation Investment (I3) scheme is finally gathering speed. The first project to receive support has been announced and the first call for proposals under a capacity-building strand is due to be published in December. While broadly welcoming the scheme, interested groups want to see improvements in the work programme for 2023 - 24, which is expected to be published shortly. Link



Innovate UK: BBSRC and partners launch six health innovation hubs

ScienceBusiness- BBSRC and partners have launched 6 innovation hubs as part of a new Diet and Health Open Innovation Research Club (OIRC). The Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council (BBSRC), with support from the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra), Innovate UK and the Medical Research Council (MRC), have created a new Diet and Health OIRC. Stakeholders doubtful EU health data space will launch on schedule

EURACTIV- Stakeholders expressed concern that the European Health Data Space (EDHS), aimed at reforming the sharing of health data across hospitals around the EU, will launch as planned in 2025 due to a large number of issues still to be addressed. <u>Link</u>



COP27: EU left 'disappointed' by lack of ambition in final deal, calling it a 'small step forward'

Euronews- By Jorge Liboreiro. The European Union is not hiding its disappointment with the climate deal struck at COP27, criticising its lack of ambition and warning of an increasingly distant possibility to keep global warming under the 1.5 °C target.

"We have treated some of the symptoms but not cured the patient from its fever," European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said in a short reaction statement. Her deputy, Vice-President Frans Timmermans, who led the negotiations on the EU's behalf, was more scathing and left no doubts as to his frustration.

The final deal "does not bring enough added efforts from major emitters to increase and accelerate their emissions cuts. It does not bring a higher degree of confidence that we will achieve the commitments made under the Paris Agreement and in Glasgow last year," Timmermans said at the summit's closing plenary.

"It does not address the yawning gap between climate science and our climate policies." Link
